

GIMP

GIMP (GNU Image Manipulation Program) is an image retouching and editing tool and is released under the GPLv3 (or later) license as free and open-source software. There are versions of GIMP tailored for most operating systems including Mac OSX, Windows, and Linux. GIMP has tools used for image retouching and editing, free-form drawing, resizing, cropping, photomontages, converting between different image formats, and more specialised tasks. Animated images such as GIF and MPEG files can be created using an animation plugin.

User Guide

The GIMP online User Guide contains a wealth of information on making the most of this tool and includes: working with images, painting and text; photograph enhancement and colour management; scripting; using the various tools; an overview of the various GIMP menus; working with filters.
